Under the federal *No Child Left Behind* Act, students attending certain failing Albany public schools are entitled to apply for a **transfer to a non-failing public school OR to receive supplemental education services**, such as after-school tutoring. OTHER PUBLIC SCHOOLS – DISTRICT'S OPEN ENROLLMENT POLICY

Open enrollment is a process through which parents can enroll their children in a school other than their neighborhood school. Open enrollment applies to non-magnet schools only. Every spring, the school district determines the schools and grade levels where space is anticipated for the following year. Spaces are filled through an open enrollment lottery. Siblings of students currently enrolled in a particular school are given preference and may be admitted without going through the lottery process, provided space is available. Acceptance into a school by lottery is determined by availability of space and maintenance or improvement of racial balance. Occasionally, students are placed due to extenuating circumstances, after careful review by the superintendent of schools.

To apply for open enrollment, parents must complete the open enrollment application and return it to the District's Office of Pupil Personnel Services by **June 1st**. For more information, interested parents should contact the District's Office of Pupil Personnel Services at **426-7210**.
